This form (formerly Standard LOR) now includes space on page 3 for a traditional letter for letter writers that prefer the traditional letter. The new standard candidate assessment form is the only required letter of recommendation document. A traditional letter is not a requirement and will only be accepted if included on page 3 of this candidate assessment form and not as a separate document. Dec	Interventional Radiology - Independent	Diagnostic radiology residents should apply as either an ESIR Applicant or as a Non-ESIR Applicant. ESIR Applicants must be accepted into an ACGME approved Early Specialization in Interventional Radiology curriculum within their diagnostic radiology residency.  ESIR Applicants must include an ESIR Applicant Diagnostic Radiology Program Director Standardized Letter of Recommendation as part of their ERAS Interventional Radiology-Independent application. ESIR applicants should give the standardized letter template to their diagnostic radiology program director who must complete all four sections before providing the letter to ERAS. Sept	Emergency Medicine	<p>The Council of Emergency Medicine Residency Directors has introduced a new Standardized Letter of Evaluation (SLOE) form for those applying to Emergency Medicine.</p> <p>To request a SLOE, please send your letter author the ERAS Letter Request Form (that should include your ERAS Letter ID), and the SLOE website link (<a href="#">SLOE</a>), which has instructions for completing the Form and information on eligibility requirements.</p> <p>Applicants applying to ACGME-accredited emergency medicine programs should consider completing the <a href="#">AAMC Standardized Video Interview (SVI)</a>. To obtain an invitation to the SVI interview platform, applicants should log into <a href="#">MyERAS</a> and acknowledge their intent to complete the SVI on the MyERAS dashboard. Sept	Orthopaedic Surgery	<p>For letters of recommendation to orthopaedic surgery residency applications, the American Orthopaedic Association’s (AOA) Council of Orthopaedic Residency Directors (CORD) requests an Electronic Standardized Letter of Recommendation (eSLOR) as a replacement for a traditional narrative letter of recommendation. A separate written letter of recommendation is not necessary if utilizing the eSLOR.</p> <p>After sending the request form to your author(s), visit the eSLOR Applicant page on the <a href="#">AOA website</a>. You must first sign an agreement and enter your ERAS AAMC ID before letter author(s) can begin an eSLOR.</p>
